I was fortunate in the first 3 weeks I had the opportunity to take each class for at least a day as well as go on school camp for 3 days, giving me the opportunity to get to know the students and staff. Miss Premrl's question of inquiry is 'Does the explicit teaching of elements of a complex sentence and the associated metalanguage have an impact on students' writing?' It will be interesting to see the results at the end of the projects.

Please be aware that next week (Week 6) Friday 9th of June, the school is having a planned Pupil Free Day. This will allow families to have an extended long weekend, as on Monday it is a public holiday for the King's Birthday. On Friday staff will be once again focusing on the actions in Curramulka Primary School's Site Improvement Planning, especially in the areas of vocabulary building, grammar and reading goals. Presently I am feeling very blessed to have landed in such a beautiful school with very accommodating students and dedicated teachers. I am looking forward to working alongside the families and the School Governing Council as we move forward in your child's/children's journey of learning.
