From The Principal

Dear Curramulka school community,

We certainly started the year off with a bang. The start of the year was packed to the rafters with activities inside and outside the classroom and here we are at the end of term one already. I have highlighted just a few areas below with accompanying gallery of photos to remind us of this whirlwind term.

Sporting Programs

As a school we once again enthusiastically participated in the Aquatics programs at Port Vincent. We cheered our fellow houses and our school at Sports day in Warooka and participated with gusto at Interschool at Minlaton.

Curriculum

Inside our school besides the normal rigor in both Mrs Tilbrook's Junior Primary and Miss Premrl's Primary class, this years grade 3 and 5's have completed NAPLAN in both Literacy and Numeracy. We have embarked on Metacognitive thinking with the explicit teaching of and the development of Learner Agency towards becoming independent learners with me in Integrated Studies. In Science the Primary students have completed amazing projects about local biomes and have also completed a text analysis and book recommendation in Literacy. The Junior Primary have all demonstrated growth in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy. They have participated at a high level in Music and Art classes and have produced amazing Lion art pieces which are on display in our Art space. The whole school has enthusiastically embraced Auslan Language lessons and have started immersing themselves in Digital Technology lessons both with Kimberly Hodges.

Student Voice

During our whole school meetings, the children discussed changes to the yard and the equipment. I am pleased to say, driven by student voice we have two new swings and the flying fox has finally been replaced and taken its rightful place back in our playground.

The children also discussed having a mud kitchen and sand area complete with water access, and this too has been ordered ready for installation in about week 5 of term 2. The children with myself used this as a learning activity in both Geography and Sustainability and helped map the best area for the kitchen and sand, taking into consideration current infrastructure, water run-off, weather and wind interference. The new area for our kitchen and sand pit will be behind the library.

Extended Curramulka Community

To connect with our Active Kids play group, we had our first visit to the gym to read to the children. Pearl, Grace and Cash did a brilliant job. We also replaced our fridge in the gym so that Active Kids families can store perishable items. This will also be utilised once we begin cooking next term. Of course we kept the box it came in and this provided much entertainment for the toddlers.

I hope everyone has a relaxing break and look forward to seeing everyone's smiling faces back ready to learn in Term 2.


